 - Any time in between, if necessary




Teaching / Support / Advice

Some Good Practice for Your Studies

90-100: Outstanding 80-89: Excellent 70-79: Very good 60-69: Good 50-59: Adequate 40-49: Less than adequate

> 30-39: Poor 0-29: Very poor

 - Required commitment is getting higher and likelihood of getting top grades is getting lower
- Deal with lectures and labs when they are scheduled
- Learn to coordinate your time so that you can cope with the assessment load towards the end of a semester

Extenuating Circumstances

- Extenuating circumstances (ECs)
 - Events that affect your performance in assessments which are unforeseen, unpreventable and out of your control short-term circumstances
- Steps
 - Step 1: Talk to us (e.g. your personal tutor or the welfare officers)
 - Step 2: If appropriate, make a claim by filling out the online EC form




Extenuating Circumstances

- Timeline for submitting an Extenuating circumstance form
 - For coursework
 - Claims must be submitted BEFORE the coursework deadline
 - For timetabled examinations/assessments
 - Claims must be submitted within 7 days of the affected examinations.
 - Requires evidence but can initially submit without evidence
- All claims must be submitted online





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
Disability and Academic Support

 - Step 1: Talk to your personal tutor
 - Step 2: Contact Disability Support or Academic Support
 - Step 3: Get a Support Plan (e.g. extended deadlines for coursework; extra time in exams)


