Submitting your Eol

- You should by now have 4 of these prepared
 - Most of each document will be the same
 - Emphasise why you would be best for particular ones
- Don't forget a cover sheet
 - Tells us what Eols you want to have considered
 - What two projects you really don't want to do
 - In case you have only subscribed to really popular ones
- Only one per group
 - It says attach CV but
 - Just do this once each person individually

Preparing for your pitch

- Monday at 2
 - Sarah and Peter will meet to work on who can pitch for what
- Wednesday we will issue you with notice of TWO pitches
 - Get ready to give them on the 28th
 - Do some background on the company
 - It would be an idea to have done this already
 - Do some background on the topic
 - <Example of bad interview given here>
- Timetable will be issued on Wednesday
 - It will have the room numbers

Dress

- The pitch is not so formal
 - But come neatly dressed
 - T-shirts can be used if they are appropriate
 - But mostly Shirt and trousers/skirt or modest dress
 - No need to glam up – look business like

Prepare

- Run through
 - Out loud in front of each other
- You don't all have to speak
 - But you all have to be ready to answer questions
 - Don't butt in but be prepared to add if you think someone else has missed the point
- You are being measured as a team not a set of individuals

Pitch

- Turn up on time (that means early)
- Ensure to all be there
 - If you know you have some unavoidable appointment
 - Make sure the others know where you are
 - Check that everyone knows where to find the place
 - Go to the right building
 - LT2 is the room where the lectures are
 - C60, C1 and C80 are all on the C floor of CS
 - Other rooms are in the Dearing Building – Education School

Timing

- The whole thing needs to run smoothly
 - 10 minutes talk
 - 5 minutes question
 - Under run rather than overrun

Enthusiasm

- Make sure they know you want this job
 - Even if you had rather done another
 - You need the job!
- And remember which pitch you are giving
 - <Example wrong application goes here>

Don't overstate or understate

- Your qualifications
- Your experience
 - You don't want to end up under achieving
 - Over achieving is OK

Tuesday 1 November

- Or the next day
 - Should know your project
- After that
 - Meet up with your staff supervisor
 - Arrange to meet as a group
 - Contact the sponsor – unless that is your supervisor
 - Start to work on your first sprint meeting

In the mean time

- You can set up your project repository
 - You need to use our Gitlab server.
 - Next week I will go through Gitlab and Trello and Git and GitKraken
- For industrial projects you may have to use another server
 - But you will need to mirror everything on our git lab server
